The aim of this Montréal Hospital District Study was to examine the roles and effects of a major hospital on its urban surroundings. The facility that we chose to analyse is the Salvation Army Catherine Booth Hospital (C.B. Hospital). It receives patient transfers from primary hospitals across the island of Montréal who require physiotherapy and occupational therapy treatment.

The purpose of the Hospital is to supply services to those requiring intensive inpatient and outpatient physical rehabilitation."
