#### MONTCLAIR AVENUE ELEVATION

The facade of the hospital on Montclair Avenue maintains the tree-lined frontage of a typical N.D.G. neighbourhood which provides an impressive, uniform canopy along the entire length of Montclair (at least during the Spring and Summer months). The sidewalk too, runs uninterrupted along the entire length of the block, hardly revealing the hospital's presence from most perspectives.

#### WALKLEY AVENUE ELEVATION

The Walkley facade reveals more clues to the time-lapsed, patchwork construction to the hospital. It is quite a contrast to the more monolithic appearance of the Montclair facade. In general, this side of the structure is less uniformly composed than the Montclair avenue side, but in many regards it is more actively engaging. The steps up to the old entrance are the closest that the building comes to connecting with the sidewalk on the Walkley side of the block. Strangely enough, the old main entrance is no longer used as a public entrance at all, but still has the appearance of a main entrance. Instead, the taxis, vehicles, and pedestrians seem to gravitate towards the side "ambulance" entry, off of the Walkley parking lot. This entrance is more user-friendly than the front entrance, due to the fact that it has automatic doors and a wheelchair ramp, which is very appropriate for the patient base which is now served by this facility.
